

Rancho Cordova Initial Draft Maps Hearing

Districting Process

Step	Description
Hearing 1 August 7	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
Community Forum August 10	Informal discussion of process, mapping tools, neighborhoods and communities of interest.
Hearing 2 August 14	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
Initial Map Deadline August 18	Initial deadline for residents to submit draft maps for Council consideration at the August 29 hearing.
Draft Maps Posted August 22	All draft maps must be posted on the project website 7 days in advance of the August 29 hearing.
Hearing 3 August 29	First Council consideration of draft maps.
Community Forum August 30	Informal discussion of draft maps.
Final Map Submission Deadline September 7	Deadline for residents to submit draft maps for Council consideration at the September 18 hearing.
All Draft Maps Posted September 11	All draft maps must be posted on the project website 7 days in advance of the September 18 hearing.
Hearing 4 and Map Selection September 18	Council consideration of draft maps, selection of preferred map and election sequence, and introduction of ordinance adopting the map.
Hearing 5 and Map adoption October 2	Public hearing followed by second reading of the ordinance adopting the map.



Districting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact (Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited: "Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

3. Other Traditional Districting Principles

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth



Community Input

Communities of Interest suggested by forum & hearing participants:

- Neighborhoods north and south of Folsom are very different from each other and should be drawn in separate districts.
- On the west end of Folsom Blvd, the neighborhoods north and south of Folsom Blvd. share similarities and should be drawn in one district.
- Districts should be drawn to cross over Folsom Blvd to reduce the division between the north and south.
- Keep old Rancho Cordova together; keep the neighborhood bounded by Coloma, Sunrise, Zinfandel, and Folsom Blvd. together.
- Use the freeway as a natural border.
- Consider business districts.



Draft Maps Overview

- □ 20 five-district maps submitted
- □ 7 six-district maps submitted
- □ 6 seven-district maps submitted
 - Four five-district maps are not population balanced.
 - Four maps raise FAIR MAPS Act concerns (split and/or bypass neighborhoods)
 - One six-district map is not population balanced.
 - One seven-district map is not population balanced.
 - Three sets of identical maps (506 and 507; 509 and 510; 601 and 602)
 - Twenty unique population-balanced, contiguous maps submitted by residents
 - NDC added one map based on community input
- □ The 20 population-balanced maps are grouped for this discussion






Draft Map Review

- □ The 20 population-balanced maps are grouped for this discussion
- □ Population-balanced maps roughly fall into six groups:
 - Five-District Maps
 - Group 5A: Two Districts North of Folsom Sunrise Blvd Boundary
 - Group 5B: Two Districts North of Folsom Crossover Sunrise Blvd
 - Group 5C: Lincoln Village w/ Tierra Grande Together Sunrise Blvd Boundary
 - Group 5D: Lincoln Village w/ Tierra Grande Together White Rock Boundary
 - Six-District Maps
 - Seven-District Maps




Not Population Balanced






FAIR MAPS Act concerns





Two Districts North of Folsom / Sunrise Blvd Boundary









Lincoln Village w/ Tierra Grande Together – Sunrise Blvd Boundary

Lincoln Village w/ Tierra Grande Together – White Rock Boundary



Six District Maps






Seven District Maps














Interactive Review Map

Public Hearing & Discussion

- □ Which group's approach best represents your neighborhood or community of interest?
- □ Are there any group you would propose eliminating the entire group?
- □ In each group, which maps do you prefer?
- □ Goal: narrow list down to 3 to 5 "focus" maps, or 2 maps per # of districts
- □ Allows residents to focus on a few key maps in detail rather than all 20 maps
- □ Council can ask demographer draw variations or revisions of a map
- □ The public can continue to draw and submit additional maps
- Any Council direction on revisions or combinations of maps NDC should prepare?
